Covid Symptoms

If your child has any of the symptoms below, you must not send them to school. Instead you will need to arrange a PCR test by booking online or calling 119. A lateral flow test is not to be used when children are showing symptoms, as it is designed to detect the virus when children are asymptomatic (no symptoms).

- A new cough
- A temperature of 37.8 or above
- Loss of taste or smell

Covid Situation	What should I do?	Can my child still attend school?
My child has symptoms	Get them a PCR test not a lateral flow test	Keep them at home until you get a negative result. School will need to see this test result prior to them returning. If you can't get a PCR then they must isolate for 10 days.
Someone in our household has symptoms but not my child	Nothing, as long as your child has no symptoms you do not need to do anything.	Yes
My child tests positive on a lateral flow test	Your child needs to isolate for 10 days. They can be released early on day 6 if they test negative on day 5 and 6 on a lateral flow device and do not have a temperature. The day that you take the test is classed as day 0. School will require evidence of negative day 5 and 6 in order for the child to return on day 6. They should not be tested before day 5. It is likely that a positive lateral flow can be a very faint line, if you are unsure you should take a cautious approach and book a PCR test.	No
Someone in our household has tested positive on a PCR or lateral flow device	Your whole family are close contacts, the government advise that all close contacts should test on a lateral flow test daily for 7 days. You may be able to access a PCR test but these are limited for close contacts who are not critical workers.	Yes, as long as they are negative they can attend school. If you can't get tests then your child can still attend school as long as they have no symptoms.
Someone in school has tested positive and I have received notification that my child is a close contact.	The government advise that all close contacts should test on a lateral flow test daily for 7 days. You may be able to access a PCR test but these are limited for close contacts who are not critical workers.	Yes, as long as they are negative they can attend school. If you can't get tests then your child can still attend school as long as they have no symptoms.
